### FIRST LESSON: Deuteronomy 5:12-15

It is not mere idleness that is enjoined in the third commandment. The ultimate purpose of the Sabbath is the contemplation of God's mighty works and acts. He made us and not we ourselves; he saved us by his mighty and outstretched arm.

Observe the Sabbath day by setting it apart as holy, just as the LORD your God commanded you. Six days you are to serve and perform all of your regular work, but the seventh day is a sabbath rest to the LORD your God. You are not to do any regular work, you or your son or your daughter or your male servant or your female servant or your ox or your donkey or any of your livestock or the alien who resides inside your gates, in order that your male servant and your female servant may rest like you. Remember that you were slaves in the land of

Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out from there with a strong hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the day of rest.

#### SECOND LESSON: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

If the children of Israel had reason to come together and hear of the mighty acts of God, how much more reason we have to do the same. And in hearing the effective word of the gospel, we receive the light from God that preserves us in this life and will raise us up on the last day to worship him, our Savior, for all eternity.

Indeed, we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," is the same one who made light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the person of Jesus Christ. We hold this treasure in clay jars to show that its extraordinary power is from God and not from us. We are hard pressed on every side, yet not crushed; perplexed, yet not despairing; persecuted, yet not forsaken; struck down, yet not destroyed. We always carry around in our body the death of the Lord Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. To be sure, while we are living we are continually being handed over to death because of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our mortal flesh. So then, death is working in us, but life is working in you.

#### GOSPEL LESSON: Mark 2:23-28

The Pharisees missed all the joy that God wanted to give them on the Sabbath. And why? They did not really listen to the law that they professed to know and love so well, nor to God's own commentary on it in the example of David. If we, like them, despise his Word, we too will miss its saving benefit and without the Word fall into error and unbelief.

Once on a Sabbath day, Jesus was passing through the grain fields, and his disciples began to pick heads of grain as they walked along. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath day?" He replied to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and hungry (he and his companions)? He entered the house of God in the time of Abiathar the high priest and ate the Bread of the Presence, which is not lawful for anyone to eat, except for the priests. He also gave some to his companions." Then Jesus said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is the Lord even of the Sabbath."
